In the meantime, I wish our students continued success over the Trinity Term





Emily is a Book Mastermind



Emily Martin (Year 8) came third in the area finals of the “Book Mastermind” competition, which is organised by Suffolk Library Services in order to get more young people into reading.

The competition works like the television show “Mastermind”, except that the specialist subject has to be a book, and is open to Year 7 – 9 students from across the county. “Book Mastermind” starts in schools in the Michaelmas term, with winners from each school then going onto compete in area finals in February.

The area competition was held at Bury St Edmunds Library and there were two rounds. First there were a series of questions on a book of the competitor’s choice, Emily’s was “Earth Girl” by Janet Edwards, which she had read 12 times since October! The second round was on general knowledge. Emily said “My house has always been full of books and I’ve read lots from an early age. I took about 400 books out in 2 years at middle school and I read the whole Harry Potter series in under 2 weeks! I really enjoy reading”.

Tiffany Hutton, Subject Leader for English, Literacy and Drama at Ixworth Free School said “Emily’s knowledge of her chosen book and her general knowledge was truly impressive. Her love of reading is inspiring and she did fantastically well in the competition.”

On the 20 April 2016, Lucas Measures, Lilley Currie, Kim Goss and Elizabeth Bolton competed in the regional finals of the UKMT team challenge. They were competing against 18 local schools, including a number of private and grammar schools and ended up winning the event, therefore qualifying for the national finals in London on the 20 June 2016. The UKMT team challenge is a national competition for the most able mathematicians and this year there were over 1700 schools entered of which only around 70 qualified for the national finals. This was a massive achievement and proves just how talented our students are. Good luck to them all for the finals.

Cross Trust Competition Fame Lab

A team of young scientists from Ixworth Free School travelled across to Saxmundham Free School on 2 February 2016 to compete against Beccles and Saxmundham in the latest Cross Trust Competition – Fame Lab. The competition, open to Year 7, 8 and 9 students from the three schools in the Trust, saw each team of students give short presentations on a science topic of their choice.



Beccles Free School did incredibly well to retain the title they won last year and were presented with a special 'Cross Trust' trophy as the overall winners, after their students from Year 7 gave an excellent presentation on global warming, and students from Year 8 did an exciting demonstration of the science behind bubbles. Ixworth Free School meanwhile was announced as Year 9 winners after giving a fascinating insight into how glow-sticks work. All presentations, which varied from fire breathing to the solar system, were judged by Izzy Botfield from Eastern and Otley College and Eric Spicer OBE, who runs a STEM enrichment class at the Free Schools.



Dr Rob Cawley, Principal and CEO of the Seckford Foundation Free Schools Trust, said: "The Cross Trust Challenges are a great opportunity for students from all three of our Free Schools to come together to compete, have fun, discover new skills and talents and make new friends. The challenges set reflect our Trust-wide approach of helping students to develop a love of learning for life, which will guide them beyond the school gates.

Official Opening

On February 25, The Lord-Lieutenant of Suffolk, Lady Clare Euston, unveiled a commemorative plaque at Ixworth Free School during the grand opening of the new facilities. The opening event celebrated the end of the two-stage, £4.4 million refurbishment programme which has been ongoing since the school opened in September 2014.

The school was in need of expansion and refurbishment to accommodate growing student numbers and to provide more modernised learning spaces. The building work has included a new 200-seater multi-purpose hall, a versatile outdoor learning space, new entrance and reception areas and complete refurbishment of classrooms.



As part of the upgrade of facilities Ixworth Free School becomes the first local school to create a 4D interactive classroom which brings teaching and learning to life. The £40,000 investment in the 4D 'immersive' technology means 'real life' sensory experiences such as walking in space or in a rainforest can be created, blurring the line between the physical and digital world.

The Lord-Lieutenant of Suffolk, Lady Clare Euston, said: "I thoroughly enjoyed seeing the inspiring new facilities which the students of Ixworth Free School are now enjoying."

Niki King, Headteacher at Ixworth Free School, said: "The new and refurbished facilities are an excellent addition to the school, providing fresh, inspiring and motivating learning environments for all students to enjoy. Thank you to all involved in the refurbishment programme, we're looking forward to using the new facilities this school year and for years to come."
